When the public comment period opens for your item, and you hear your name in that list, please raise your hand. You can do this by clicking "Raise Hand" under the "participants" menu, which you can find at the bottom of your screen on the Zoom platform, or by pressing \*9 if you are joining by phone. The Commission staff member who is facilitating public comment will call on you upon seeing your raised hand. Commission staff will unmute your microphone when your name is called.

To make in-person public comment, please fill out the physical comment card provided during the meeting. Prior to making your comments, please state your name for the record and identify any group or organization you represent.

Public comments will adhere to the length the meeting chair announces during the meeting. Commission staff will share a timer and ask speakers to end when their time is up.
